FROM THE RECTOR

THE INDIAN BAZAAR is one of the events in the school calendar that put us in touch with the great world.

Although the Bazaar involves money, it's not about money. There may be some big spenders at the Bazaar, but surely most of us are buying up modestly, and there are always some giving their widow's mite. It's the many small trickles of money that stream in, and reaching Hazaribagh or the other Mission places make a difference to people's lives. For once, money (that tainted thing as the Lord calls it) is the occasion of a positive connection between people. People in Australia and indeed in Lane Cove touch people in India and indeed in Mahuadanr, or in East Timor and indeed in touch with some, maybe a few, people in Suai.

All these people have names and stories. My non-anonymous fiver becomes a book, or pile of beans, in the hands of someone so far away I will never know their name or story. Of course, that Aussie note might help build a school, or dig a well, or stock a dispensary, or pay a teacher, and financially speaking it just vanishes with all the other single notes to become the big donation that makes something biggish happen. But ultimately the enterprise is about helping people, which means an array of individuals going to that school to be taught by that teacher, or the gathering of people around a convenient well to draw water rather than walking miles to do so, or a queue of sick lining up for

the dispensary to open. Each of them with their name and story, about which I know nothing.

We are taken away from ourselves and our local preoccupations and excitements in Lane Cove and Australia to think of something going on beyond us, and we help, however slightly, to make that something good happen there. Somebody there goes home having learnt a little more today, or drunk a beaker of cleaner water at last, or eased their pain, thank God.

A very remarkable day in so many ways

FROM THE HEADMASTER

Like everyone else in Sydney I woke on Wednesday morning to an amazing red glow in the sky.

My initial concern was that my hedge was on fire, however, after walking outside I could see that the day ahead was going to be quite remarkable and one all of us would remember and talk about for a long time.

One of my first responses was to email all parents requesting they not send their sons to school if they suffer respiratory problems or from any form of asthma. You can then imagine my alarm when after attending Mass at the Therry Campus I saw a number of boys walking out through the College gates, all under the impression there was no school today.

I also met numerous boys who were phoning their parents to say school had been called off and there were no boys at all at the College. In fact more than 80% of students did attend school on Wednesday and no classes were cancelled.

It would be interesting to find out how this particular rumour started while I was ensconced in the Chapel. My email to parents was one of caution and I believe essential given the prevailing weather conditions.

FAREWELL TO MARK AND SUE MCGINNITY

While next week will be the last week of formal school for the graduates of 2009, and they will be toasted and celebrated through our traditional Valette Assembly, the Blue and White Ball and the Valette Mass and dinner, next week is also significant in the life of the College as it is the last week at Riverview for Mr Mark McGinnity, our Director of Boarding and his wife, Sue.

Mark has been at Riverview for the past nine years and during that time he has had an enormous impact on the culture, life and growth of our boarding community.

Mark came to the College at the start of 2001 – the year the school made significant changes to its leadership structure. A few months previously I had been appointed Head of School, and Mark, along with five other Directors were appointed members of the College Executive team.

At that time we set a number of common visions and goals for the College including:

- ✦ that students may feel known, recognised, valued, respected, listened to and cared for;
- ✦ that they may also receive a total formation towards excellence through a wide range of academic programs and other experiences;
- ✦ that every staff member may feel valued, respected, empowered, challenged and cared for and
- ✦ that all parents, sharing our values, may cooperate with us through regular, open and honest communications with our staff.

Looking back over the years he has been with us, I can say without hesitation that Mark has certainly achieved these goals for the boarding community; in so many ways he has also been instrumental in ensuring these goals have been met for the whole school.

Mark took over as Director of Boarding at a time when significant changes were happening in boarding schools across Australia. Under his direction, every aspect of boarding at Riverview has undergone a remarkable transition including the types of accommodation offered; the service programs and the extra curricular activities boarders are now involved in and the variety of food on offer in the Refectory (some boarders might say this is his most important achievement!).

The year Mark first arrived was the first full year senior boarders spent in the newly built Kevin Fagan House; it also saw the demise of the famous open dormitories in the Main Building as Divisions II and III (as they were then known) moved into St John's House.

The nature of boarding has also changed considerably: the boarding house is now more a home away from home and there is a far greater emphasis on providing a family atmosphere in the boarding houses with each division under the care of a married couple. Mark has also encouraged more women to become involved in the care and supervision of our boarders.

Over the years, Mark has tried to reduce that sense of isolation some boarders may feel while away from their families. Gone are the days when a boarder had to queue in line and wait for three days to use the one telephone available in the boarding house to make contact with his family; now through the internet and mobile phones boys are no longer victims of 'the tyranny of distance'.

Mark and his team have also ensured the boarders have the same access to technology that dayboys do through the introduction of computers in studies and web access for individual pc's.

The academic tone and Higher School Certificate results in the boarding house have also improved remarkably under Mark's tutelage with a greater emphasis on how to study and write examination responses, the effective use of study time and the introduction of more tutors for boarders.

Mark has also been responsible for an increase in the marketing of the College – his regular presence on country visits has helped make Riverview well known in country towns across NSW. He is always remembered by parents for his friendliness and his genuine interest in the people he meets.

Mark and Sue's passion and concern for, as well as their commitment to, the young men placed in their care have always been outstanding and everywhere evident. Never have I known them to be daunted by the 24/7 nature of supervision that comes with boarding.

Mark, as you are probably aware, has been appointed to the headship of Monivae College – an appointment he most richly deserves. We wish him and Sue well in their new life in country Victoria. In fourth term Mark will be working at Xavier College. He will then take up his appointment at Monivae at the start of 2010.

Thank you to all those volunteers – their numbers seem to be increasing every year – and friends of the Jesuit Mission Office who worked so tirelessly throughout the day. Thank you also to all our staff who helped out – including the Housemasters and Tutors who ran stalls as well as staff who helped prepare the grounds. In addition, I thank all the boarders and the boarding staff who on the Sunday morning, as they always do, worked so hard cleaning up rubbish and making sure the grounds were tidy for the start of school the next day. Their contribution to the Bazaar was fantastic.

FROM THE DIRECTOR OF RELIGIOUS FORMATION

FAITH IN SERVICE PROGRAM

This program across the school has been designed to suit the age level of the students. As such, years 5 and 6 are involved with raising funds for a number of designated charities. Years 7 and 8 are required to complete ten hours of voluntary work. Years 9 and 10 are involved with 15 hours of service, where they are asked to move themselves outside of their comfort zone and begin to engage more closely with the poor. Year 11 complete 20 hours of Ignatian service, which requires them to engage with those who live on the fringes.

Catholic Social Teachings associated with the 'preferential option for the poor', and the particular focus Saint Ignatius had to 'help souls' underpin this program.

Years 9 and 11 throughout this term have been led through a process of reflecting on their experience. In conversation with staff and peers, students, not only recount their experiences, but to delve more deeply into the feelings they have associated with their experience.

These are precious moments. Such a range of experiences are involved and the impact this experience has on students is varied. This process allows for students to really consider and discuss why it is in this College that such demands are placed on students.

Further to this, the 2 Unit year 11 Studies of Religion students completed an assignment which asked them to: 1) define the term 'Dignity of the human'; 2) In light of their service experience, choose an associated government policy and briefly explain it; 3) Assess the policy in light of the term 'dignity of the human, and 4) Outline ways that the school could be made more aware of the issues surrounding this area.



Quite a demanding task, which the students responded to most positively. Many of their suggestions for Section 4 were innovative. I wish to share some of them with you.

Harry Dalton suggested that we students 'adopt a grandparent'; Jack Ballhausen posed the idea of having 'Wisdom Day'; Jack Gracie suggested we invite people with a range of experiences to the library to be 'human books'. Rob Beamish suggested having 'mental health week' as a part of our College Calendar. Henry Jacobs wondered if there was some way we could have gap students from Sudan.

Some of these ideas are very simple actions that will be explored at an executive level. I commend these students on their efforts.

For the second year now, Mr Barry Smith and Mr Andrew Szabo will accompany ten students as they undertake an Immersion to Micronesia for ten days where they will work alongside the Jesuits. We wish them safe journey.

3. EXAM STRESS

Some hints for parents of Year 12s

1. Set reachable goals. Help them set goals for revision weeks as well as for single study sessions. Emphasise that half-hour goals are equally as important as larger goals.
2. Help them to manage their time. They may need to say no to requests and invitations.
3. Be available for your sons' academic support and praise them for asking for it. Check how they're feeling about the exams by asking them, and help them set up emotional support if it's needed.
4. Encourage your sons to remember the positive aspects of their previous study experiences.
5. Help your sons to challenge their negative thinking and replace their negative thoughts with more positive ones.
6. Make sure you know how to get a good night's sleep and pass this information on.
7. Encourage your sons to vary their revision methods. The techniques that require them to speak out loud are particularly important because the step from thinking to speaking about a topic sorts out what they know and don't know.
